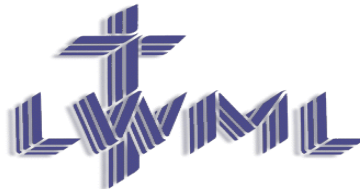

Recognized Service Organizations – July 1-15

Recognized Service Organizations (RSOs) are independent of the LCMS, but their aims and ministries are in harmony with the work of the LCMS. Through LCMS World Mission, 20 RSOs carry out mission and ministry in conjunction with the LCMS.

Daily Prayers:

Sunday: For Family Shield Ministries, which educate and equip people, through the power of the Gospel, to know Christ, grow in His Word, and strengthen individuals and their families. Pray also for the work of Lutheran Outreach Ministry, which provides a unique model for ministry that can be used in other areas of urban ministry; walking with families by feeding the physical and personal needs of families and ministering to their spiritual needs as well; evangelizing the unchurched by seizing the various opportunities among families.

Monday: For International Student Ministry, which is a friendship and hospitality-focused outreach among international students, spouses, and children who have come to the United States from other countries. About 720,000 international students study in the United States every year!

Tuesday: For Lutheran Inner-City Network Coalition (LINC) in Houston, the Twin Cities, and North Texas, whose ministries' focus on church planting in cross-cultural and urban contexts, along with grassroots leadership and empowering local missionaries to impact the lives of their diverse urban communities. Pray too for Philadelphia Ministries, which also focuses on mission and outreach in urban Philadelphia.

Wednesday: For the ministry of Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots, U.S., which shares Christ's Gospel with Native American people for ministry to their own people and to others. Pray also for Lutheran Bible Translators, which makes God's Word available to all people in their heart language. They also work in literacy training, so that people with newly translated Bibles can share them with their communities.

Thursday: That the Lord would bless the ongoing work of Lutheran Blind Missions, which provides training and resources to develop communities among people who are blind, provides resources and training to equip leaders who are blind, and provides resources and training to strengthen believers, so that people who are blind and visually-impaired may read, hear, believe, and share the light of salvation seen through the cross of Jesus.

Friday: For the work of Lutheran Campus Ministry, which empowers Lutheran ministers and the broader church to be effective witnesses of Christ in the academic community.

Saturday: For the Lutheran Deaf Mission, which engages in evangelism and Christian education training to help deaf people and their families know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.
