LCMS missionaries on home service – June 16-30

Every other year, international missionary families spend approximately two months in the United States on “home service.” During this time, they reconnect with individuals, congregations, and other groups who support them in their mission work for mutual encouragement and celebration. Most also take vacation time to spend with their families.

Daily Prayers:

Sunday: That congregations and other groups would experience a revitalized interest in mission prayer and financial support after visiting with missionaries face-to-face and hearing about ministry that God is accomplishing through them.

Monday: That through missionaries sharing their ministry experiences and joys during their home service, the Holy Spirit would challenge listeners to consider serving as a missionary themselves—in a short-term, long-term, or career capacity.

Tuesday: For the families of visiting missionaries—that they would be able to enjoy their time together and mutually encourage one another.

Wednesday: For God to comfort and sustain the missionaries who are not able to see family and friends in the United States this year—may the Holy Spirit comfort them with His presence and assurance of God's calling to serve far from home.

Recognized Service Organizations – July 1-15

Recognized Service Organizations (RSOs) are independent of the LCMS, but their aims and ministries are in harmony with the work of the LCMS. Through LCMS World Mission, 20 RSOs carry out mission and ministry in conjunction with the LCMS.

Thursday: For Apple of His Eye Mission Society, as it carries out the Great Commission, with a special focus on reaching the Jewish people with the Gospel. Apple of His Eye also serves as a resource to congregations, church groups, and individuals who desire to learn more about bring the Gospel to the Jewish people.

Friday: For the ministry of the Brazil Mission Society, which gathers and disseminates information in the U.S. regarding the work and needs of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Brazil and connects individuals and congregations with opportunities to be involved in mission work in Brazil.

Saturday: For Children's Christian Concern Society (CCCS), which gathers and sends financial support to further the Christian education of children around the world. CCCS supports projects in 21 countries.
