From the Pastor's Desk

"Does Going to Church Make You Christian?"

In a late-2017 article entitled "Meet the 'Spiritual But Not Religious", the Barna Group described a growing segment of our population that identify themselves as ones who "love Jesus but not the church." These people strongly identify with their faith (they say their religious faith is very important in my life today), they just don't attend church. Which brings up a question: Does going to church *make* you Christian? Since we are not given the privilege of looking into the heart and discerning the faith as only God can do, what are we left with? Words? Well, yes. Words count; your confession of faith counts.

But even more than words count, worship *does* count. Your regular hearing of the Word of God and you're eating the Supper of Jesus counts. Jesus' own example shows the importance of Temple and synagogue. As was His habit, He went to church. There is not much disagreement in this. And so did His disciples. Luther certainly picked up on this by tying the failure and refusal to worship (The Third Commandment) to the act of despising the Word of God.

The Book of Hebrews (chapter 10, verse 25) gives us a hint that although the expectation was always there in the beginning, Christians did need encouragement to go to church. Does going to church make you a Christian? Can't we just "love Jesus but not the church" and call it good?

Certainly, simply walking into a church building on a Sunday morning will not make you a Christian, but it puts you where the Word and Spirit of the Lord are at work to make you Christian and *keep* you one.

Going to church may not make you a Christian but I would say that it is a good indicator that you seek to be one (by God's grace and favor and not of works). And this is a truth that we can share with our "Spiritual but not Religious" friends and family. God gives us many blessed opportunities to speak the truth in love to those who seek life apart from the gathering of the faithful around Jesus' Word and Sacraments. We can remind them that it is the greatest gift of God to love Jesus AND the church. Invite them to join you and all the other broken yet forgiven sinners at Peace with Christ. Invite them to come and hear the Words of Jesus proclaimed on a Sunday morning rejoice that they are loved by Jesus and His Church!

Just a Note

In September 2017 LCMS Witness & Outreach Ministry, in conjunction with Concordia Publishing House, announced the release of the core module kit of the *Every One His Witness* $^{\text{TM}}$ (*E1HW*) program, a new evangelism resource aimed at helping Lutherans share the Gospel with those whom God has placed in their everyday lives.

Witnessing. What's it all about? The *Every One His Witness* Lutheran evangelism program puts sound doctrine into practical action for sharing the faith with people in our everyday lives.

Participants learn: What is witnessing? Why do we witness? And the "how-to" of witnessing using the LASSIE approach — Listen-Ask-Seek-Share-Invite-Encourage.

LASSIE means listening to those who are unsure about Christianity. It means asking questions that aren't accusatory. It means sharing the Good News about Jesus. **Notice how there's no bashing, no judgment, and no forced imposition of beliefs.** Instead, there's understanding, communication, and honesty between friends. And *Every One His Witness* teaches you how.

The program takes place in two parts: First, an on-site core module training led by a local leader. Second, attendees are invited to join the context module training website to dive deeper into specific contexts.

This fall at Peace with Christ, the Board of Evangelism will be offering a 6 week evangelism program, *Every One His Witness* led by Rev. Magruder. Invitations have gone out to individuals for our first session but if this interests you, please get in contact with a member of the Evangelism board; Rhonda Kaiser, Wes Nierman, Paul Rubel, Dan Cerman, myself or Rev. Magruder.

For Higher Things (July)



 Council is continuing to develop a recommended Budget to bring before the Congregation. The Council will meet again on Monday, Oct 1 to continue working on the Budget.

- Sunday, November 11 at 1:00pm. Congregational Voters Meeting for elections and approval of the 2019 Budget.
- Paul Rubel received a draft of the Financial Review/Audit report. Council
 voted to authorize Paul to approve the draft and finalize the process to
 receive the final report. Council will review the final report at a future
 meeting.
- Council briefly discussed the open positions for the 2019 Church Council; President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Youth, Education, Hands-in-Harmony, Fellowship, three Elders and two Trustees. Anyone interested in learning more about these positions can contact Dan Prevedel.
- The Evangelism Committee is going to be offering a group of members the
 opportunity to participate in the initial classes this fall for the "Every One
 His Witness" program. It is anticipated that additional classes will be held in
 the future.
- Council Members will be working with Scott French to install Servant Keeper (the membership database) on their personal computers which can assist in improving communications with members.
- The clean-up and inventory of the various storage areas is scheduled for

Saturday, October 20 from 9:00 am–12:00 pm. All committees and groups who have items in any storage area are encouraged to participate and assist with the inventory and clean-up of items belonging to them.

The Financial Reports are provided in the Council Broadcast article instead

review and approve the monthly Financial Reports prior to providing the
information to PWC members.

The Financial Report for August 31, 2018 was not approved by Council as there were questions on a variety of items. Treasurer Sara Buchleiter was unable to attend the Council meeting and the report will be brought before Council for approval at the next meeting after the questions have been answered.
